# **Mini-Series**



This is an overview of the event;

- 1 May the 1st event will be a CT Dressage and Cones casual turn-out; critique of dressage and cones; also allow a "reader" for the dressage test
- 2 June 2nd. event will be an HDT Horse Driving Trial - Dressage, Cones and Obstacles - we would like to see a more "proper" turnout with apron, etc.
- 3 July 3rd event will also be an HDT a different dressage test

This is an excellent opportunity for ALL levels of drivers and equines. It is casual event and is not rated although we will follow driving rules and these will be posted ahead of time in order to help you learn about these types of driving competitions. And for those of you who will be competing this is a fantastic opportunity to school your horse/pony. The July event will probably be the Dressage Test for Metamora CDE so you'll want to take advantage of being able to have a critique before that CDE.

While there will be a low entry fee this is a chance for you to learn more about competition without the higher cost of a rated event as well as not having to travel, stay at a hotel etc. Thank you so much to Carrie Ostrowski for proposing and bringing this idea to fruition. AND a huge

#### Treasurer's Report for 2021

A Treasurer's report has been a regular feature of the online newsletter, so I'm taking this opportunity to provide a quick overview of the club's finances for 2021. Spokes and Spurs is on a sound financial footing. The bank balance at beginning of the year was \$3,886.95 and as of December 31, was \$4,379.42.

Income for 2021 totaled \$2,111.00, primarily due to membership dues (\$1,795.00); additionally, the silent auction held during the December 12 in-person annual meeting raised \$316.00. We'd like to thank our silent auction donors and bidders.

Expenditures for 2021 totaled \$1,521.67. The club did not keep me overly busy last year as only 13 checks were issued, the principal ones being:

- \$483.55 to American Reliable Insurance
- \$200.00 to Lexington Carriage Classic (sponsorship)
- \$187.08 AGM food/drink
- \$200.00 to CAA (rental donation)

- \$119.88 (web hosting)
- \$100.00 to National Drive (sponsorship)
- \$80.00 for Shakertown Drive
- \$35.98 to Blue Host

During the executive committee's November 7 inperson meeting, Ann Katona, David Gaston and I determined that the club would make the following donations in 2022 to support driving activities in our area:

• \$200.00 to the CAA for the use of their office for club meetings;

- \$200.00 to Lexington Carriage Classic;
- \$100.00 per event to the National Drive

Now a summary of memberships. For 2021 Spokes and Spurs received 60 memberships, 35 family and 25 single, encompassing a total of 97 members. This is virtually the same as in the previous year when we had 61 memberships, 37 family and 24 single, covering 116 members and membership renewals are starting to come in for 2022. Your board has been busy planning a full schedule of club activities for 2022, including a series of three mini CDEs, clinics with Thorsten Zarembowicz at Coach House Farm, a drive at Shakertown, and in person educational meetings (provided the pandemic does not intervene). Many of our members will also be volunteering and/or competing at the Lexington Carriage Classic that will be held June 23-25 at the Kentucky Horse Park. It bears repeating that it takes a growing and *involved* membership to provide an interesting calendar of events so do your part and make it a New Year's resolution to rejoin Spokes and Spurs today. We look forward to seeing many of you at club activities throughout the year.
