


Newsletter



We are looking forward to seeing everyone again in June!New to pleasure driving? A little nervous about going to your first show?



As of April 30, 2022, I'm pleased to report that Spokes and Spurs has a healthy bank balance of \$4,835.96 and continues to bring in sufficient revenue to cover outgoing expenses. Memberships currently stand at 41 (30 family and 11 single), with a total membership of 79 individuals.
